



## SIR JOHN SOANES MUSEUM

The Museum was designed by one of Britain's greatest architects, Sir John Soane (1753-1837) and was his home as well as his private Museum. Behind its unusual projecting façade lies London's most unexpected interior, every aspect of which reflects its creator's architectural ingenuity, imagination and love of beauty.



Receptions take place in the Library/Dining Room. Guests may wander through the ground floor rooms of the Museum, visiting the famous Picture Room with its two sets of paintings by William Hogarth, the Dome area and the Soane Exhibition Gallery.

For dinners, pre-dinner drinks are served in the elegant first floor Drawing Room, recently restored to its original 'Patent Yellow' colour with yellow silk curtains and authentic carpet. A short guided tour of the Museum can be given, prior to dinner being served in the 19th Century candlelit setting of the Library/Dining Room where diners are surrounded by mirrors reflecting the Pompeian red decoration, the Greek vases and other works of art.
