



TWO TEMPLE PLACE

Two Temple Place is an unrivalled venue for functions of a personal or corporate nature, combining the grandeur of a state occasion with the intimacy of a party in a private house.



The staircase hall and gallery, panelled in oak, complemented by a chimneypiece in paonazetto marble and a floor of marble, jasper, porphyry and onyx laid in geometrical patterns, the hall itself is overlooked by a gallery of a further six statues with American literary associations, a frieze in rilievo of eighty-two characters from Shakespeare's Othello, Henry VIII, Antony & Cleopatra and Macbeth and ten pillars of solid ebony.



The Great Hall is an exclusive and prestigious room of considerable elegance and character which can be adapted to accommodate either the most lavish of events or an occasion requiring a more intimate or under-stated atmosphere.

The Library also leads directly off the gallery. One side of the room is filled with bookcases and above these and the mahogany door are a number of panels modelled by W.S. Frith, also in low relief, and between them finely carved figures representing the Arts and Sciences.
